

Can you make some ladybirds using paper. Draw some spots on one side, count them then draw the same on the other side and count. (Doubling). Try printing the spots and counting using wine bottle corks. Try doubling using toy cars, felt tips, socks etc. Keep practising counting, shape & numeral recognition <https://www.topmarks.co.uk/learning-to-count/ladybird-spots>

Continue to practise phonics using alphablocks.your child will be working on satpinmdgockbluhref. Practise writing the letters. Your child could try reading these High Frequency words by matching them, play hiding them around the house, garden and finding them. Write them in sand, paint, chalks or paper. **Mum dad ball I like my cat dog house look at and.** Try putting them into sentences: I like my mum etc and have a go at writing them.

Paint a picture of ladybirds, try printing spots on lady birds shapes using anything circular. Fingerprint ladybirds and bugs.
