Create a simple phrase from their responses. As a class, children to sort pictures of adults into trusted adults. For each one decide why they are trusted. Create a simple phrase to describe a trusted adult. If something happened to you and you didn't like it, who would you tell? Class discussion. What would happen if you saw something when on the Internet and you didn't like it, who would you tell? Reinforce the importance of keeping them safe and the adult can deal with the issue safely. If you were playing with a friend and they wanted to go somewhere else, what would you do? Why? How many of you use the Internet? Why is it important to stay on the sites your adults have let you on. Why should you not use other sites?
