I know I have to keep my personal information private. I know that I can only share my personal information when I am told I can. I know that it is wrong to give other people's personal information without their permission. I know what a password is used for. I know why it is important to keep them private.	What is my personal information? Why should I keep my personal information safe? Have a set of information and the children decide whether it is private or not. What is meant by private information? Why should it be kept private? This information should only be shared with a trusted adult. Watch the Youtube video. What were the mistakes the children made? What should they have done? What learning points would you give them to follow? Now ask chn what passwords are used and why they are important? Explain that strong passwords are very important in the online world to protect your computer and other devices and the information found on them. Pop three fake passwords on the board (make sure chn know they are made up ones, not real, and emphasise that chn should never share their passwords with anyone, especially not in what could be a phishing email (explain what this is) and ask chn in pairs to decide which is a weak, medium and strong password.
