1	E-Safety	I can explain that not everyone is who they say they are online. I can understand that accounts can be hacked.	I know that not everyone online is a real person. I know that to pretend to be someone else is wrong and sometimes breaking the law. I know that online accounts can be hacked by other users. I know that hacking an online account is a criminal offence.	Is everyone who they say they are online? What is hacking? Why do people hack accounts? How do you know who you are talking to? Thinking of the children in the class, who would you share important information about yourself? Why? (Trust) Using a blindfold, have a pupil pick someone who they would share information with then go out of the room. When they come back in, the person they have selected speaks to them but they are facing another child. Remove the blindfold. What did they notice? Why did they still talk to them? Explain that this is what can be like online. You are never sure who you are communicating to especially when sending messages. Why do people pretend to be other people? What do you call someone who pretends to be another person by taking over their accounts? This is illegal. How do they hack into accounts? Need to keep passwords and usernames safe and private and not to share with anyone (other than trusted adults). Create a class set of rules to follow to keep the children safe. All children sign up to it. Individually produce a poster which shows a messages from the learning.
