PHYSICAL DEVELOPMENT

Just a Minute!

This activity fosters coordination and motor skills. Materials: space (indoor or outdoor), timer or clock

Challenge your child to see how many jumping jacks they can do in a minute. Before they start, have them predict how many they will be able to do. Can they do as many as they thought?

Then have your child try it with other kinds of movements too, like push-ups, sit-ups, or arm circles. This is a great activity to return to day after day. Can kids beat their own records?

Read Spider stories, try the Very Busy Spider By Eric Carle.

Can your think of an animal. They will act
like this animal for one minute without

How many spiders did you find, let me know! Can you make a mark (tally) for each spider? Make a spider using playdough and make 8 legs. Egg boxes, pipe cleaners, paper etc.

Count out 8 cars, felt tips etc.

CREATIVE DEVELOPMENT



Whilst on a walk in my local community, I came across some signs which I thought was a lovely idea.

Hey, Neighbour! This activity fosters creativity and empathy. Materials: paper, felt tips, chalks, paints

Point out to your child that a lot of people are staying home right now and can't play with their friends and neighbours. Ask your child: What is a message or a wish you would like to share with people in our community? Then have them make a sign to share that message with your neighbours. Put the sign in your window or in your front yard so that other people who are staying home can see it when they look outside. And when you look outside, see if you can spot signs or messages that other people have made!
